Draw yourself in this picture of fall.

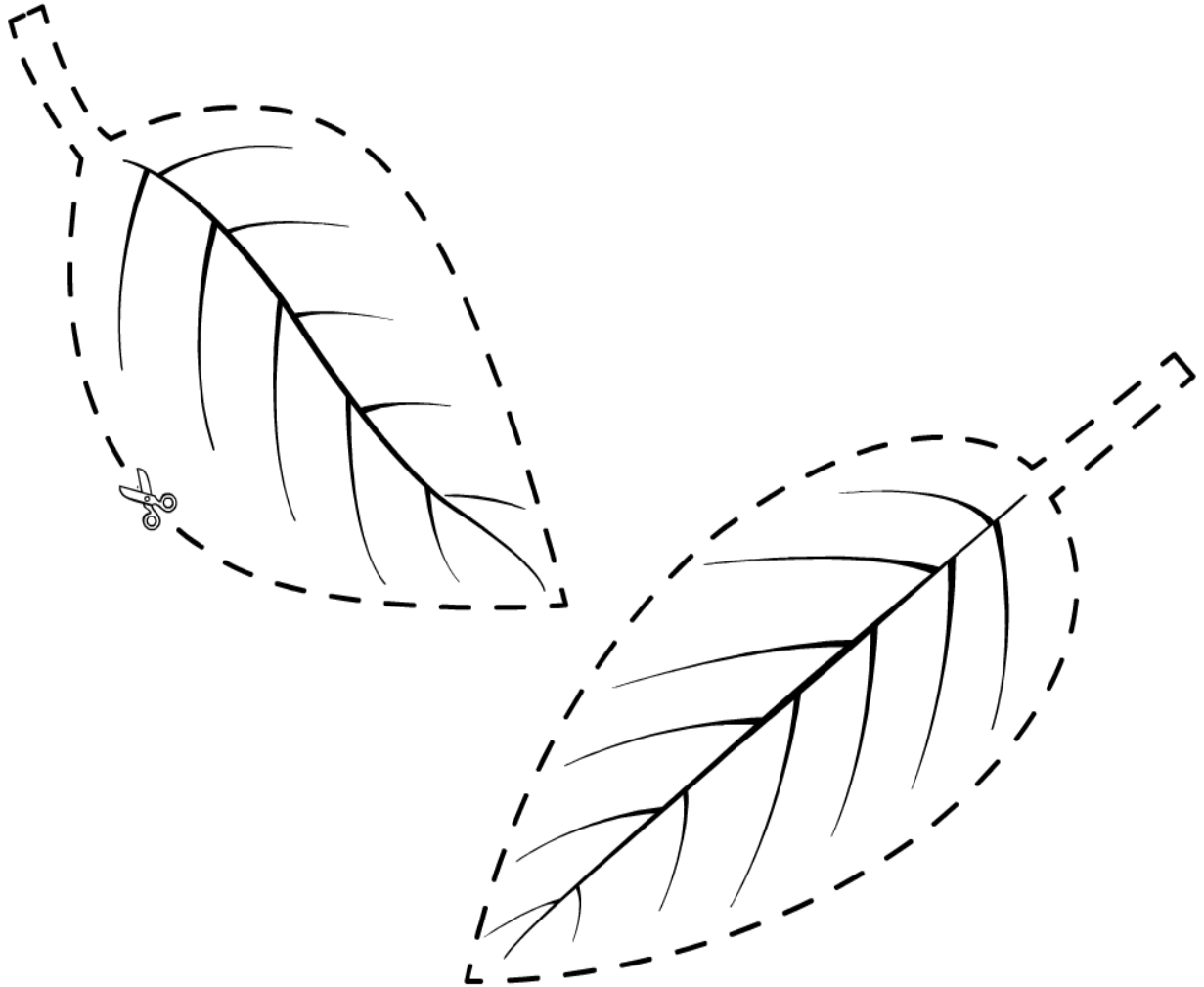

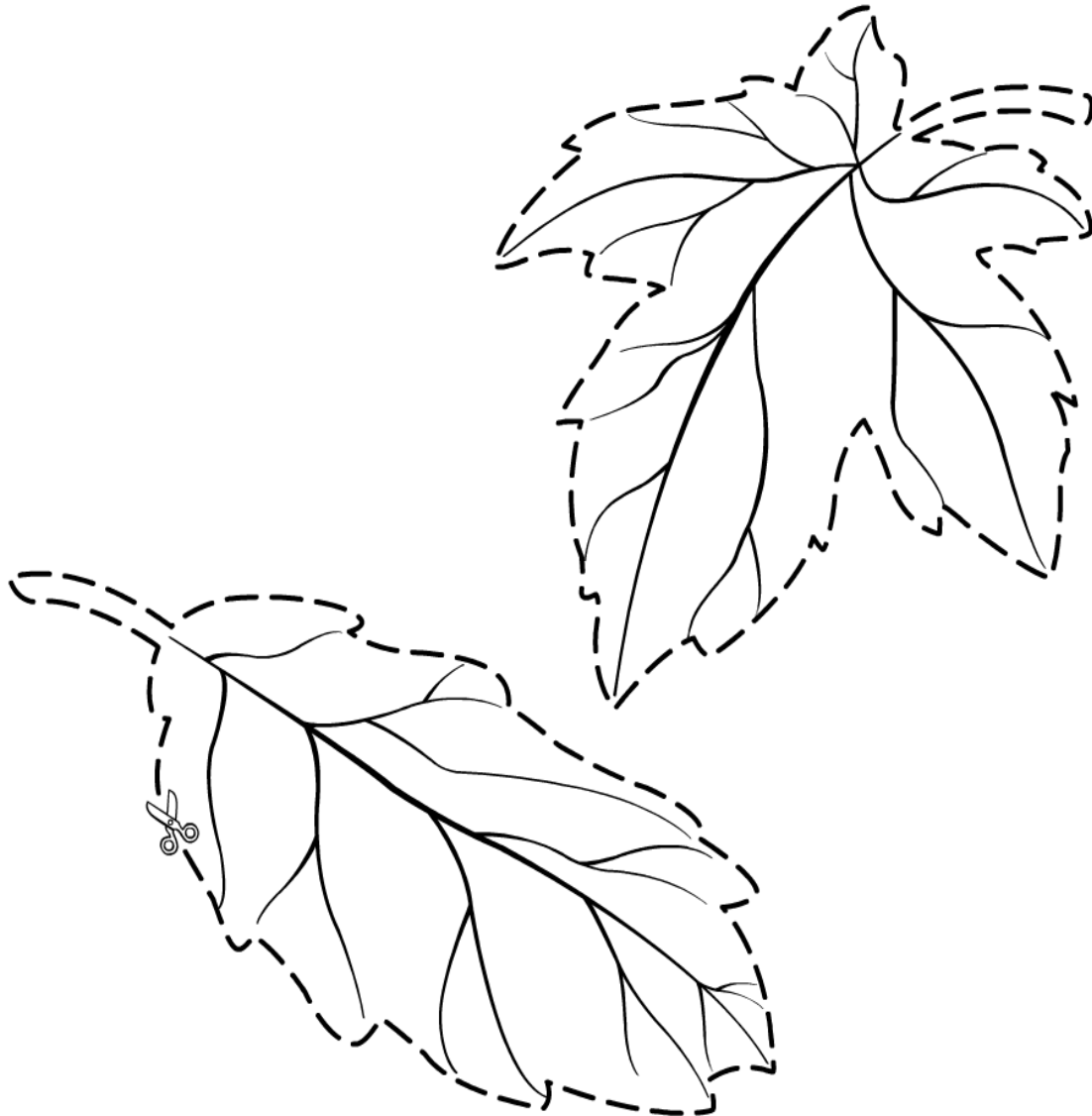
