

Building Teacher Leadership Capacity for EdTech Initiatives

trial and error, these teachers have the best handle on what works to support student achievement at their sites. They are often already leaders among colleagues who turn to them with classroom tech questions.

"The dedicated work of innovative classroom teachers — working as teacher leaders — is the 'secret sauce' for meeting the needs of all students in this global, digital age," explained educational technology consultant Ann McMullan.

The ISTE workshop and, in a more condensed format, the online seminar will provide strategies and tools to build teacher leadership capacity. Participants will leave with PD implementation plan models, tools and resources to support PD at their sites, and a participant community with which to continue the conversation moving forward.

Digital literacy and technology skills are critical to helping students tackle Common Core standards and be college and career ready. Due to budget constraints, complex staff schedules, and the breakneck pace of edtech change, many districts are looking to blended models of PD.

The first of 10 key components listed by California County Superintendents Education Services Association (CCSESA) for successful 21st century planning and Common Core implementation is "capacity building and leadership development." In light of California's shift to the Local Control Funding Formula, the state is in an important position to lead the way on teacher leadership development. "Key to this effort is building the capacity ... to better support teachers, to utilize their leadership skills, and to support increased collaboration and professional learning."



"Having worked in leading the K-12 transformation of learning and teaching through technology for over 16 years, I know that there is no more critical change agent for this process than the classroom teacher," noted McMullan. "When teachers are given the appropriate support in terms of leadership, professional development, and opportunities for meaningful collaboration, their impact is boundless."

Empowering teachers to serve as local experts solves three challenges faced by districts as they emphasize professional development to increase student achievement:

- External trainers can't be everywhere at once.
- Trainees become passive, diluting their impetus to find and develop solutions.
- When external trainers move on, follow-up guidance does too and implementation stalls.
